**DEFINITION OF THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL
HERITAGE (STATE)**

**HERITAGE CODE - TITLE V: PROVISIONS APPLICABLE IN
FRENCH POLYNESIA (Articles L 750-1 to L 750-4)**

Article L750-1:

Articles L. 212-30, L. 221-1 to L. 221-5, L. 222-1 and L. 222-3 are applicable in French Polynesia.

Article L750-2:

Article L. 510-1 is applicable in French Polynesia.

Articles L. 532-1 to L. 532-14 and L. 544-5 to L. 544-11 are applicable in French Polynesia in conjunction with properties located on the State maritime public domain.

Article L510-1:

Archaeological heritage includes all remains, and any other traces of the existence of mankind, whose preservation and study, especially through excavations or



discoveries can retrace the history of humanity and its relationship with the natural environment.

Article L750-3:

For the purpose of applying Articles L. 750-1 and L. 750-2 in French Polynesia, terms listed hereinafter shall be replaced as follow:

- a) “department” or “region” by the words “territory of French Polynesia”;
- b) “préfet” by “representatives of the State in the territory”;
- c) “general council” or “regional council” by “assembly of French Polynesia”;

Article L750-4:

Without appropriate adaptation, references in provisions of this code applicable in French Polynesia, to provisions that are not applicable are replaced by references to provisions in conjunction with the same object applicable locally.
